

ESSENTIAL CIVIL WAR CURRICULUM

Dr. George H. Junne, Jr. is Professor and Chair of Africana Studies at the University of Northern Colorado. He is a specialist on African Americans and film, the Black American West, Blacks in the Civil War and general African American history and culture. Also, he has written on the African American town of Dearfield, CO, and Black eunuchs of the Ottoman Empire. He has authored *Blacks in the American West and Beyond - America, Canada and Mexico: A Selectively Annotated Bibliography (Bibliographies and Indexes in Afro-American and African Studies)* (Santa Barbara, CA: ABC-Clio, 2000), *The History of Blacks in Canada: A Selectively Annotated Bibliography (Bibliographies and Indexes in Afro-American and African Studies)* (Westport CT: Greenwood, 2003) and *A History of the Fifty-Fourth Regiment of Massachusetts Volunteer Colored Infantry of the Civil War* (Lewiston, NY: The Edwin Mellen Press, 2012). He holds memberships in the Western Social Science Association and the Western History Association.

During the summers, Dr. Junne is a fossil collector for the University of Michigan Museum of Paleontology and Johns Hopkins University. He also works with an archaeology crew at North Park and at Dearfield, both in Colorado. Several times, he has been a visiting professor at Bogazici University in Istanbul. Junne holds a Ph.D. from the University of Michigan.
