ESSENTIAL CIVIL WAR CURRICULUM

Phillip W. Magness (George Mason University) is a historian of 19th century political economy, specializing in slavery and tax policy. His current research focuses upon the black colonization and emigration movements, particularly in connection with Abraham Lincoln. He is the co-author of Colonization after Emancipation: Lincoln and the Movement for Black Resettlement (University of Missouri, 2011). His work on the Civil War era has appeared in scholarly outlets including the Journal of the Early Republic, the Journal of the Abraham Lincoln Association, Slavery & Abolition, as well as popular outlets including Britannica and the New York Times' Disunion. He is presently the Academic Program Director at the Institute for Humane Studies at George Mason University, where he also teaches in the Public Policy graduate program.
