ESSENTIAL CIVIL WAR CURRICULUM

Mary DeCredico joined the History Department in 1986, after receiving her Ph.D. from Vanderbilt University. Her specialty is the Civil War era and the Confederacy. Mary's first book, *Patriotism for Profit: Georgia's Urban Entrepreneurs and the Confederate War Effort* (Chapel Hill: University of North Carolina Press, 1990) received the Museum of the Confederacy's Jefferson Davis Award for outstanding scholarship on the Confederacy. She has also written *Mary Boykin Chesnut: A Confederate Woman's Life* (Lanham, MD: Rowman & Littlefield, 1996), which is in its second printing, as well as several articles and book chapters. Her current project, *Richmond Goes to War, 1861-1865*, is under contract with the University Press of Kentucky. Mary also serves as a member of the editorial board of the *Georgia Historical Quarterly* and the Naval Civil War Museum Advisory Board.

Mary has filled several administrative positions. After serving as History Department Chair, she was named the Academy's Vice Academic Dean. In 2005, she took leave without pay to accept the position of Provost at Bucknell University, a post she held until her return to the Academy in 2008.
