

ESSENTIAL CIVIL WAR CURRICULUM

Dr. Mark A. Weitz received his B.A. from the University of Texas-Austin and his J.D. from Baylor Law School. After eight years of practicing law he returned to school in 1992 and earned his M.A. in history from Texas State University and his Ph. D from Arizona State University. He has held university positions teaching the American Civil War and U.S. constitutional history and is the former Director of the Civil War Era Studies Program at Gettysburg College. After his tenure at Gettysburg College, he returned to private legal practice in Austin, Texas. Dr. Weitz has authored numerous articles on the Civil War and written five books on the Civil War and U.S. constitutional history. *More Damning than Slaughter: Desertion in the Confederate Army* (Lincoln: University of Nebraska Press, 2000) is the preeminent study on Confederate desertion. His other books on the Civil War are *More Damning Than Slaughter: Desertion in the Confederate Army* (Lincoln: University of Nebraska Press, 2005) and *The Confederacy on Trial: The Piracy and Sequestration Cases of 1861* (Lawrence: University of Kansas Press, 2005). In addition to his work on the American Civil War he has written on controversial topics like clergy malpractice and immigration for the award-winning series *Landmark Law Cases and American Society* published by the University Press of Kansas.
