Lloyd A. Hunter (B.A., Southern Illinois University; B.D., Eden Theological Seminary; M.A., University of Missouri, Kansas City; Ph.D., St. Louis University, American Studies) is professor emeritus of history and American Studies at Franklin College, where he founded and directed the American Studies program and occupied the Roger D. Branigin Chair of History. He is the author/editor of *For Duty and Destiny: The Life and Civil War Diary of William Taylor Stott, Hoosier Soldier and Educator* (Indianapolis: Indiana Historical Society, 2010). He has written numerous articles and chapters in scholarly journals and books, along with over forty book reviews and review essays. In 2003 he was selected as the outstanding Indiana Professor of the Year by the Carnegie Foundation for the Advancement of Teaching and the Council for the Advancement and Support of Education (CASE).
